With electronic gadgets becoming difficult to repair, activists and consumer organisations are advocating the 'Right to Repair' movement, which aims at enabling consumers to repair their industry.

For example, a smartphone's battery is likely to degrade over time and slow down the device's performance. And, if the battery is not replaceable, the consumer is forced to dump the device and spend thousands of rupees on a new phone. Right to repair advocates also argue that this will help boost business for small repair shops, which are an important part of local economies. More important, it will help reduce the vast mountain of electrical waste (e-waste) that piles up each year on the planet.

RIGHT TO REPAIR MOVEMENT AROUND THE WORLD

Apart from the US, the UK, too has introduced the Right to Repair rules that should make it easier to buy and repair daily-use gadgets, such as TVs and washing machines
