



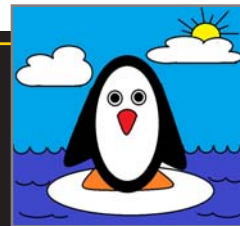

CRISTIANO RONALDO

Footballer with most international goals

Cristiano Ronaldo has become the all-time top scorer in men's international football, with two late goals as Portugal beat the Republic of Ireland 2-1, while holders France drew 1-1 with Bosnia and Herzegovina in 2022 World Cup qualifying on Wednesday.

The five-time Ballon d'Or winner also equalled Sergio Ramos's European mark of 180 caps

Best-ranked Indian batsman on ICC Test Player Rankings

opener Rohit Sharma has topped his skipper Virat Kohli to become the top-ranked Indian batsman after being placed fifth on the latest ICC men's Test Player Rankings. Rohit's scores of 19 and 59 in the third Test lifted him one place to a career-best fifth position, seven rating points more than Kohli for an aggregate of 773. The last time someone other than Kohli was the top-ranked India batsman was in November 2017, when Cheteshwar Pujara was second and Kohli fifth.

England captain Joe Root's sublime form in the ongoing World Test Championship series against India has helped him reclaim the top spot for batsmen after nearly six years



RIGHT TO REPAIR movement

WHAT is it important: Recently, the US President Joe Biden signed an executive order urging the Federal Trade Commission to curb restrictions imposed by manufacturers that limit consumers' ability to repair their gadgets on their own terms. With electronic gadgets becoming difficult to repair, activists and consumer organisations are advocating the 'Right to Repair' movement, which aims at enabling consumers to repair their electronics products by themselves or by third-party technicians. In other words, the movement demands that manufacturers make authentic spare parts of a product available to buyers of that product, giving them the power to get their product repaired from independent repair shops instead of depending solely on the manufacturer for authentic parts. The Right to Repair movement had started as a vehicle repair policy, and then reached the electrical appliance industry.

WHY is it important: With tech companies intentionally slowing down older models or products so that consumers buy the newer ones and drive up the sales, activists of this movement feel a curb on tech companies would help the customers, who end up spending huge amounts of money on these appliances and gadgets, and sometimes find them to become obsolete within a few years after purchase. For example, a smartphone's battery is likely to degrade over time and slow down the device's performance. And, if the battery is not replaceable, the consumer is forced to dump the device and spend thousands of rupees on a new phone. Right to repair advocates also argue that this will help boost business for small repair shops, which are an important part of local economies. **More important, it will help reduce the vast mountain of electrical waste (e-waste) that piles up each year on the planet.**

HOW are tech giants reacting to it: Large tech companies, including Apple, Microsoft, Amazon and Tesla, have been lobbying against the right to repair. According to them, opening up their intellectual property to third party repair services or amateur repairers could lead to exploitation and impact the safety and security of their devices. Tesla, for example, has fought against the right to repair advocacy, stating that such initiatives threaten data security and cyber security.

RIGHT TO REPAIR MOVEMENT AROUND THE WORLD

Apart from the US, the UK, too has introduced the Right to Repair rules that should make it easier to buy and repair daily-use gadgets, such as TVs and washing machines

What about India
According to the supporters of the movement, a Right to Repair law could be especially valuable in a country like India, where service networks are often sketchy and authorised workshops are few and far

FOR THE RECORD

The Global E-Waste Monitor 2020 shows that consumers discarded around 53.6 million tons worth of electronics in 2019 globally, up by 20 per cent in 5 years. India generated 3.2 million tons of e-waste last year, ranking third after China (10.1 million tons) and the United States (6.9 million tons)

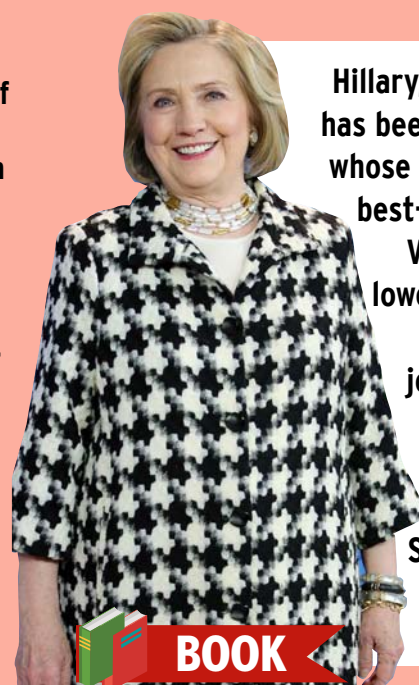

Number of Indian accounts banned by WhatsApp in the 46-day period—June 16 to July 31. Overall, more than 95 per cent of bans in India are due to the unauthorised use of automated or bulk messaging ('Spam'). These number have also increased significantly since 2019 because our systems have increased in sophistication, the firm said. In its first compliance report, which covered the time between May 15 and June 15, WhatsApp had said, it banned 2 million Indian users. In July, search engine giant Google said that it removed over 1.5 lakh pieces of content based on complaints received in May and June, and over 98 per cent of these were related to copyright.

The contemporary dance portrayed by the Secondary students showcased the life of Lord Krishna. The message that 'He will reincarnate to destroy the evil and save the good, was

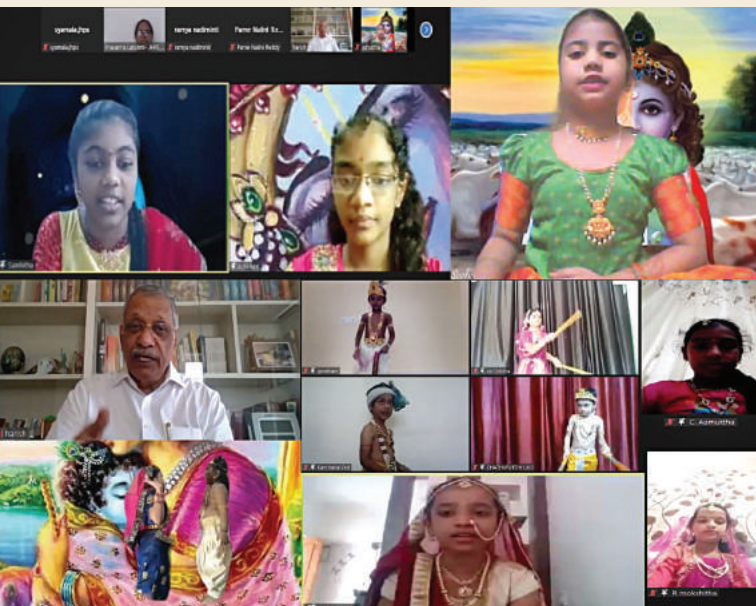


brought to life through dance performances. The famous 'Dahi Handi' game played by the students was exciting.

CRISTIANO RONALDO BECOMES TOP INTERNATIONAL SCORER

In the 2022 World Cup qualifying matches, Portugal beat the Republic of Ireland 2-1, while holders France drew 1-1 with Bosnia and Herzegovina

A day after completing his return to Manchester United, Ronaldo had an early penalty saved by teenage goalkeeper Gavin Bazunu in Faro before Ireland took the lead on the stroke of half-time. John Egan's glancing header put Stephen Kenny's side on course for a famous win, but Ronaldo broke Irish hearts with an 89th-minute equaliser — a goal that took him past the Iranian Ali Daei's record of 109. The 36-year-old Ronaldo then snatched all three points for Portugal in the sixth minute of injury time, rising highest to power in a header from Joao Mario's right-wing cross. The five-time Ballon d'Or winner also equalled Sergio Ramos's European mark of 180 caps. "(The motivation comes from) the desire I have to continue playing football, also from this last contract I signed (at Manchester United), in which I was happy to return home," said Ronaldo.

Portugal and France on top

■ Portugal sits top of Group A with 10 points from four matches, although Serbia are only three points behind with a game in hand. The group winners qualify automatically for next year's finals in Qatar, with the runners-up heading into the play-offs. France, playing for the first time since losing to Switzerland in the last 16 at Euro 2020, fell behind in Strasbourg when Edin Dzeko rifled in a low drive from 20 yards. Antoine Griezmann equalised when Dzeko's header at a corner struck France forward and bounced just over the line, but the hosts saw Jules Kounde sent off for a reckless tackle early in the second half. France hold a four-point lead at the top of Group D

above Ukraine, who conceded a last-gasp goal in a 2-2 draw away to Kazakhstan. Finland are six points adrift but has two games in hand. "Qualifying stages are difficult," said France coach Didier Deschamps, whose side go to Kiev next to face Ukraine. "We have to be satisfied with a draw given what happened. We have one point more, there are still lots more available and the match on Saturday is coming very quickly."

Latest match results

■ Erling Haaland scored his first World Cup qualifying goal in Norway's 1-1 draw against the Netherlands in Oslo. Haaland's scrappy finish gave Norway the lead on 20 minutes, but Davy Klaassen levelled before the break as Louis van Gaal began his third stint in charge of the Dutch national team. One point separates the leading four teams in Group G, with Turkey top despite blowing a two-goal lead in a 2-2 draw at home to Montenegro. Croatia, the 2018 World Cup runners-up, drew 0-0 away to Russia and remain above their opponents on goal difference as leaders of Group H. Slovakia are a point behind after a 1-1 draw with Slovenia. Daniel Wass and Joakim Maehle scored two quick-fire goals as Euro 2020 semi-finalists Denmark swept Scotland aside 2-0 to make it four wins from four in Group F. Israel are their nearest challengers after Eran Zahavi bagged a hat-trick in a 4-0 victory in the Faroe Islands. Austria are level on points following their 2-0 win in Moldova. **AFP**

TSITSIPAS ROLLS AFTER ANOTHER LONG US OPEN TOILET BREAK

The third seed beat Frenchman Adrian Mannarino 6-3, 6-4, 6-7 (4/7), 6-0 at Arthur Ashe Stadium

Stefanos Tsitsipas took another trademark long bathroom break then credited it for advancing to the third round of the US Open on Wednesday as a storm lashing New York forced the suspension of an indoor match. The 23-year-old Greek third seed was booed after taking more than eight minutes between the third and fourth sets but dominated after his extended toilet trip to flush Frenchman Adrian Mannarino 6-3, 6-4, 6-7 (4/7), 6-0 at Arthur Ashe Stadium. "I think taking a break and going to change. I was completely wet. I was refreshed," Tsitsipas said when asked about the key to sweeping the final set in 30 minutes. Tsitsipas, who matched his deepest US Open run, has been ridiculed by Andy Murray and Alexander Zverev for extended bathroom breaks seen as gamesmanship. French Open runner-up

Tsitsipas, who says he's only following ATP rules that have no time limit on toilet breaks, fired a career-high 27 aces, five more than his previous best, in winning his ATP-best 50th match of the year. "I just felt very loose on my serve," Tsitsipas said. "My ball toss was very consistent. That helped me find a spot and have points off my serve."

Osaka set to make history

Defending champion Naomi Osaka advanced by walkover while Russian second seed Daniil Medvedev breezed into the third round over Germany's Dominik Koepfer 6-4, 6-1, 6-2. Osaka reached the third round when 20-year-old Serbian qualifier Olga Danilovic withdrew due to illness. The 23-year-old Japanese third seed could become the first repeat US Open winner since Serena Williams, absent with a

torn hamstring, captured her third in a row in 2014.

Sloane sends Coco packing

Experience trumped youth as former champion Sloane Stephens' deadly forehand sealed fellow American Coco Gauff's fate 6-4, 6-2 in the second round of the US Open. The pair appeared evenly matched early on but the 17-year-old Gauff handed Stephens a critical break with a double fault on the last point in the ninth game and never regained the momentum. In the second set, Gauff failed to convert the only break point opportunity she had against the 2017 champion, who had eight forehand winners across the one-hour and six-minute meeting. **AFP**

World No. 1 Pramod Bhagat, also the reigning world champion, outwitted fellow Indian Manoj Sarkar 21-10, 21-23, 21-9 in his men's singles group A class SL3 (standing/lower limb impairment/minor) opener. **ANI**

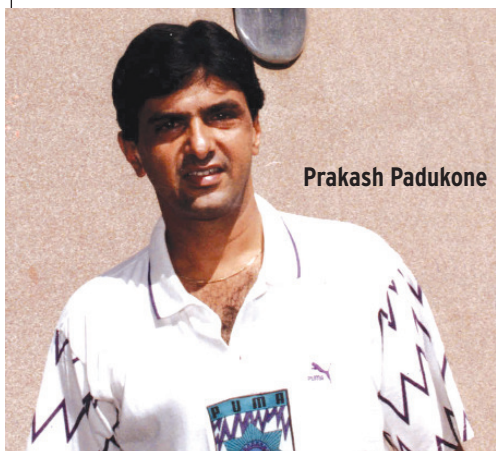
