COMING IN 4 DAYS, a law to reduce AIR POLLUTION

WHAT: A day after Times NIE raised the issue of rising menace of air pollution, the Centre informed the Supreme Court that it was drafting a comprehensive legislation to set up a statutory body empowered to take steps to prevent stubble burning in Punjab, Haryana and UP and implement measures to reduce air pollution in the National Capital Territory (NCR) and adjoining areas.

WHEN: “The comprehensive legislative step will create a permanent body with adequate powers. In the past, certain ad hoc steps were taken. Now, a statutory body will be created. We will come out with a draft legislation

THE PROPOSED LAW

- The new law would make it legally-binding for stakeholder states to adhere to the decisions of the anti-pollution body. The body will have state representatives on board, and this, it is believed, would help to ensure that the states implement measures as suggested by the body
- Since the Centre is looking to amend the Environment Protection Act, the Water Act and the Air Act, the new legislation is expected to be in tune with the proposed amendments
- Stiffer penalties are expected to be imposed for violations. The highest fine is ₹1 lakh at the moment

in four days,” the Centre told the apex court.

HOW: With Parliament not in session, the Union government is likely to take the

ordinance route to set up the permanent body, which is expected to have representations from Delhi and three states — Punjab, Haryana, and Uttar Pradesh.



The Centre's proposal to come up with a stringent law against pollution is a welcome move. However, it's important to implement and monitor the law strictly. Moreover, there should be a concerted effort to create an awareness on the need to curb air pollution. The drive against pollution should start right from schools, as students can be the biggest changemakers in creating a pollution-free planet

IPL 2020
IPL FINAL TO BE PLAYED IN DUBAI ON NOV 10


The 2020 Indian Premier League (IPL) final will be played on Nov 10 in Dubai, the country's cricket board (BCCI) confirmed on Sunday. The playoff matches will be played from Nov 5 in Dubai and Abu Dhabi. The top four teams qualify for the playoffs. Defending champions Mumbai Indians, Delhi Capitals, Royal Challengers Bangalore and Kolkata Knight Riders occupy the top four spots with three rounds left to play.

This year's IPL, which was originally scheduled to begin in March in India, is being held in the United Arab Emirates due to the Covid-19 pandemic

VOLCANIC ACTIVITY EFFECT SPOTTED ON JUPITER'S MOON IO

Astronomers have for the first time observed the direct effect of volcanic activity on the atmosphere of Jupiter's moon, Io.

To distinguish between the different processes that give rise to Io's atmosphere, a team of astronomers used Atacama Large Millimeter/submillimeter Array (ALMA) observatory in Chile to make snapshots of the moon, when it passed in and out of Jupiter's shadow. Based on the snapshots, they calculated that active volcanoes directly produce 30-50 per cent of Io's atmosphere.

SPACE

Io is volcanically-active due to a process called tidal heating. Io orbits Jupiter in an orbit that is not quite circular. The way our Moon always faces the same side of the Earth, similarly, Io always face Jupiter. The gravitational pull of Jupiter's other moons Europa and Ganymede cause tremendous amounts of internal friction and heat, giving rise to volcanoes, such as Loki Patera, which spans more than 200 km across



AFTER SHAKESPEARE TRILOGY, NOW VISHAL BHARDWAJ IS ADAPTING AGATHA CHRISTIE FOR HINDI CINEMA

Filmmaker Vishal Bhardwaj is set to adapt renowned British mystery writer Agatha Christie's works into a film franchise for the Indian audiences. Christie's crime stories centred on fictional detectives, Hercule Poirot and Miss Marple, but Bhardwaj will be introducing a new pair of lead investigators taking inspiration from one of the Queen of Crime's famous stories. According to reports, the script is currently in development, but details of which Christie novel is being adapted for the first film has not been revealed yet.

WHATSAPP TO ALLOW USERS TO JOIN MISSED CALL, ADDS BIOMETRIC AUTHENTICATION USING FACE UNLOCK

TECH BUZZ


According to reports, WhatsApp has rolled out a new update, which will allow users to join an ongoing group call with 'join missed call' feature. The feature will allow users to join an ongoing group call midway. As of now, the users cannot join a group call unless someone calls them again to enter the call. WhatsApp users will get two options — Ignore and Join. By clicking on Join, the user can send a request to join an ongoing group call.

➔ Another feature that WhatsApp is testing is the biometric lock. The new feature could soon let users open the app after a biometric authentication using their face ID and fingerprint. Currently, on Android, only a "Fingerprint lock" feature is available as a biometric lock

➔ WhatsApp already supports Face ID and Touch ID unlocking on iOS devices

➔ Another feature includes 'muting group always'

BECA

WHAT: India and the US have finalised the landmark defence pact, Basic Exchange and Cooperation Agreement (BECA) for Geo-Spatial Cooperation. The deal would help both the countries in sharing high-end military technology, geospatial maps and classified satellite data between their militaries. According to experts, the complete data, backed by highly-accurate US satellites, helps in navigation as well as targeting military assets.

WHY: Under BECA, the two countries can exchange maps, nautical and aeronautical charts, commercial and other unclassified imagery, geodetic, geophysical, geomagnetic and gravity data. Apart from the standard data, the agreement includes sharing of classified information as well, with safeguards in place to ensure that it is not shared with any other third party.



WIN-WIN DEAL FOR INDIA?

➤ According to experts, information received under BECA will be useful for long-range navigation and missile-targeting with enhanced accuracy ➤ In fact, according to them, it's a win-win deal for India, as it would get access to military-grade data that can help draw up target coordinates. For example, military-grade coordinates could help direct missiles of air-launched bombs to a terror location in the neighbourhood with high accuracy

To begin, you'll need

Any sturdy container that will not deteriorate over time like an archival box, plastic container or even a large glass mason jar.

Choose what to preserve

Obvious ideas include a timeline of events, newspaper clippings, a letter you write to your future self and lists of sights and sounds you remember.

Ideally, skip the burial

Although some people bury time capsules, you can skip that step, especially if you have decorated it carefully and filled it with precious items. Instead, store your time capsule in the back of a closet where it will be protected from water damage or fluctuations in temperature.

TASTING WHILE COOKING

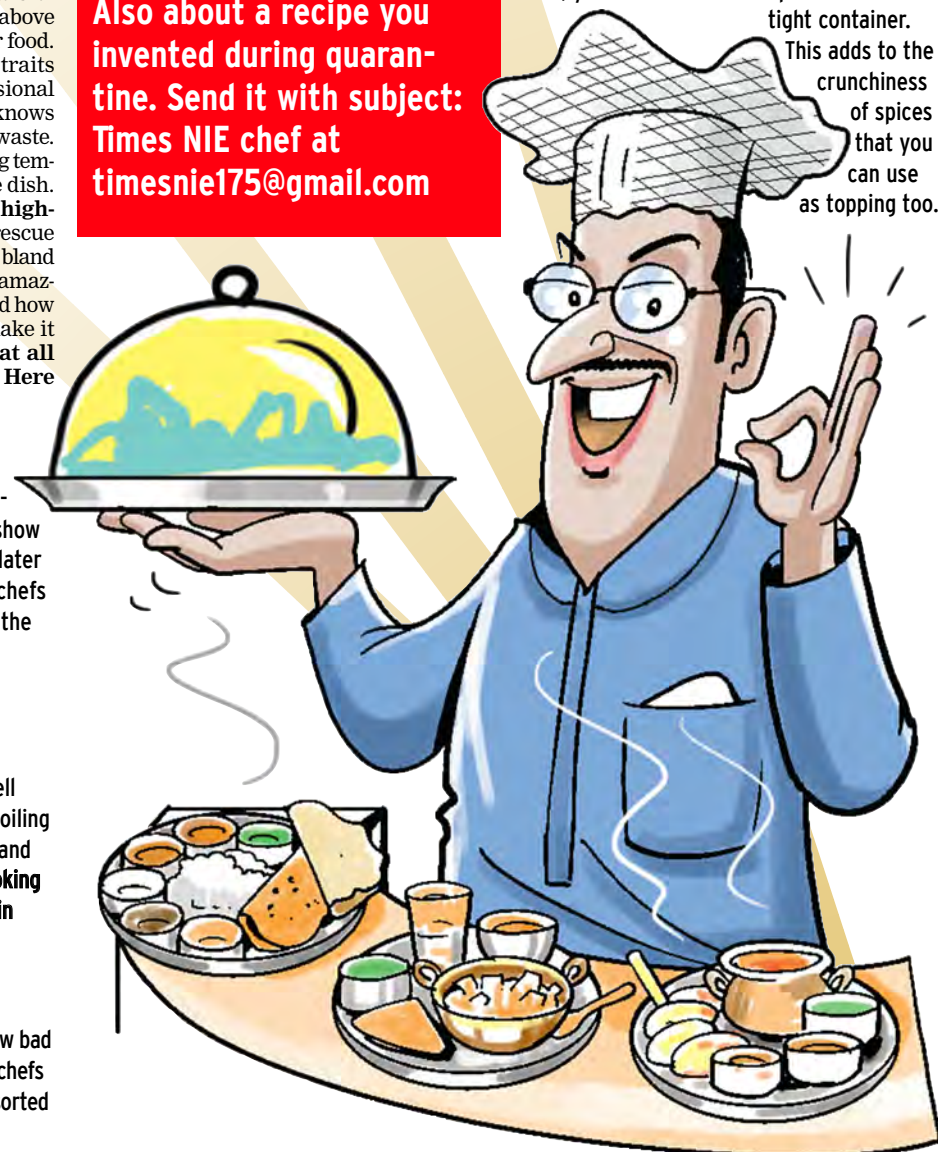

SHOULD STEVE SMITH DROP HIMSELF FROM THE TEAM?

Former India opener Gautam Gambhir explains how captain Steve Smith dropping himself out from the playing XI can help Rajasthan Royals in IPL 2020

STEVE SMITH IN POOR FORM

■ Smith is one of the best batsmen in the world but his performances in IPL 2020 have been below par for Rajasthan Royals. After two back-to-back fifties in the first two games, Smith has been struggling to attain consistency. He has so far scored 276 runs in 12 games at an average of over 25 and a strike rate of 129.57. Smith failed to fire yet again on Sunday in Rajasthan Royals' clash against Mumbai Indians where he scored 11 off 8 balls in the 196-run chase.

'Smith is the main issue for RR'

"I think Steve Smith is the main issue for Rajasthan Royals, let's be honest. I have been saying it from Day 1. Steve Smith drops himself and RR can pick themselves Oshane Thomas or any other overseas seamer in his place, alongside Jofra Archer. His performance will go up. Whoever is the captain can use Archer in a better way."

I remember the game against Delhi Capitals - they were 10/2. And they had only used 2 overs from Jofra Archer. If they had one more overseas pacer, they could have bowled 3 overs from Archer in the first six - and try to actually seal the game. Just because you know there is not enough depth and quality apart from Jofra Archer, so you have to only use 2 overs from Archer.

ARCHER WAGING A LONE BATTLE

■ Jofra Archer has been one of the best bowlers in Indian Premier League 2020 so far. He has been instrumental with the new ball for Rajasthan Royals (RR) and has also bowled well in the death overs. Archer, who has 17 wickets in 12 matches this season, has more often than not got RR off to a good start with the ball. However, his efforts have not been capitalised well by Rajasthan Royals, who cannot afford another overseas pacer in their line-up.

■ With captain Steve Smith, all-rounder Ben Stokes and Jos Buttler certain starters in every game, Archer is left to shoulder the pace responsibility alone. While Ankit Rajpoot and Varun Aaron have been disappointing, young Kartik Tyagi still needs to work on execution. Rajasthan Royals are currently placed sixth on the IPL 2020 points table.

Fans deserve to know more about Rohit's fitness: Sunil Gavaskar

The tour of Australia comprises three T20 Internationals, as many ODIs and four Tests. The series is scheduled to start on November 27

Former India skipper Sunil Gavaskar has called for more transparency on the status of 'limited-overs' vice-captain Rohit Sharma's hamstring injury after he was seen practising at the Mumbai Indians' nets within hours of being left out of the squad for an upcoming tour of Australia. The BCCI did not throw much light on Rohit's fitness and just stated that it is monitoring his progress while announcing the three teams for the Australia tour on Monday.

"We are talking about the Test matches, which are a month and a half way. What actually is the problem with him will help everybody. And if he is practising in the nets for Mumbai Indians, then honestly I don't know what kind of injury it is. I think a little bit of transparency, a little bit of openness about what actually is the problem with him will help everybody."
