


KRISHNASHTAMI CARNIVAL





NATIONAL DOCTORS' DAY

TEACH THE GERMINATION PROCESS

Germination is a very important lesson which is taught to children during their early childhood to inculcate the habit of gardening and to develop their fine motor skills. So, the teachers of DPS Miyapur took a step forward to teach the germination process to the pre primary section in a practical learning method. They started explaining the process by doing it simultaneously along with the children. The kids sowed a seed for the first time in a soiled pot with their tiny hands and sprinkled water using a watering can. After that, they kept the pot in the sun. We made a practice of watering the pot every day before starting with the class. They took good care of their tiny saplings with utmost responsibility. By these simple steps, the children completed the germination activity with a lot of effort, making this activity a grand success. The kids were overwhelmed to see their tiny saplings grow in their mini gardens, and they were ecstatic to see their hard work pay off.



LOW-STRESS OPPORTUNITY

Kids love using a salt tray (a replacement of sand) to practice forming letters. A salt tray provides a wonderful sensory experience and gives kids a low-stress opportunity to practice writing the letters of the alphabet. The purpose of the Montessori sand tray is to help a child learn how to trace letters and numbers on his/her own. The children were asked to be ready with an Inch tray, 1 Salt packet or ½ kg Semolina to do this interesting activity. They practiced drawing standing lines, sleeping lines, slanting lines, upward curve, downward curve, sideway curves and the letter A in the salt tray.



COLOUR DAY CELEBRATION

Color week was celebrated by all the students of LKG and their teachers. They were dressed accordingly in various colors on each day of the week to celebrate this occasion. Teachers spoke and sangrhymes about colors to their students.



WHEN LEARNING BECOMES A FUN ACTIVITY



They improved their vocabulary by learning a new word every day. 'Thought of the day' was introduced to start off the classes on an optimistic note.




During Science, there was a discussion on conservation of tiger, India's National animal which is also heavily endangered.



In their Social class, they held presentations on 'Famous Personalities' where they showcased their speaking skills using paper presentations and PPTs.





The students of Grade 6 took part in educating and entertaining activities throughout the month. They used trays, streamers and even cloth to explain 'the point of concurrence' in Geometry.




THE MATH MAGICIANS

The students made models of our solar system to elucidate the topic in their Science class.




They displayed small mud pots to showcase the Harappan culture of pottery in Social Studies.








Putting their scientific temperament into action, the 7th graders also engaged in a SEA activity on deriving the relation between different temperature scales. Temperature scales provide a way of quantifying and measuring how hot or cold a material is. In the United States, temperatures are usually measured using the Fahrenheit scale, while most countries that use the metric system use the Celsius scale to record temperatures. Learning about the different scales and how to interconvert between them, helps students figure out what the weather is going to be like, no matter which part of the world they find themselves in!



TELL A TALE




Inter School Quiz Competition

CLASS CONSTITUTION




FUNNY EXPRESSIONS



THE SCIENTISTS


The scientists of Grade 9 discovered their true potential by taking part in a number of challenging activities and experiments that sparked their scientific temperaments.


BIOLOGY ACTIVITY

Another Biology activity conducted among the students of Grade 9, was an experiment on the growth of Meristematic Tissues. This activity involved the observation of the roots of two onions, inversely submerged in two glasses filled with water. After the roots had grown to a considerable length, the apical meristems i.e. the tip of these roots of one onion were trimmed and observed for a few more days. This activity spanned over almost a month and students patiently and detailedly recorded their observations, tabulated the differences in the growth pattern and shared their videos and pictures with the teacher.







In History, Grade 9 learners were given a unique opportunity of making movies based on three different scenarios:


- 1. Scene from Jungvolk
