As we Dipsites entered the month of December, the threshold of 2021, we paused to reflect and evaluate. We let our thoughts percolate and pondered over them.



The Webinars

To develop a positive learning culture and to make parents an active partner in their child's educational journey, a number of webinars were organised.

Dads and Dudes

Dads and dudes was one such webinar which aimed to address the adolescent issues of teenage boys of grade 8 and 9. The participating boys and their fathers had a candid discussion with the Dr. Rajesh Khanna (MBBS, MD – Pediatrics, from The Birthplace) wherein they clarified their queries about various issues ranging from emotional health to the physical changes occurring in teenage boys.



Mom and Me

Attention to adolescent health is an important issue which should be addressed at the right time in the right manner. Aligning with this thought process, a webinar for the girl students of grade 5 and 6 and their mothers was conducted. Dr. Payal Agarwal (M.B.B.S, M.S), Consultant (OBS & GYNAE) presided over the webinar where she talked about the menstrual cycle and hygiene. She also addressed the issue of abuse and mental well being of the females.



Behaviour Modification

A webinar of Behaviour Modification of parents to incite a positive response in children for the students of grade 2 and 3 was conducted by Ms Asra, a trained psychologist. She targeted the alteration of parental behaviour so that a positive response can be incited in the children. Various issues were discussed at length. The webinar proved to be a beneficial one for the parents who are often left wondering about the correct parenting methods.






UKG INTER HOUSE RAMP WALK COMPETITION

GRADE-VIII SAHITYA QUIZ


The inter-house competition, The Sahitya Quiz, was an exciting and enriching competition.




GRADE-IX FILM MAKING COMPETITION






It is often said that Knowledge is like a garden; if not cultivated; it cannot be harvested.



It might seem like we will fail again but trusting ourselves will give us some hope and inspiration to continue learning. One of the most important things while learning a language is trusting yourself and having patience.




SHAPES ALL AROUND


The rectangular doors, triangular roofs, square windows and cylindrical chimney helped students learn about various shapes.

TYPES OF HOUSES


Shelter is one of those elements that fulfils the necessities of a man. Thus through this activity, children were able to learn about the various types of houses and their significance.

This activity guided the students in building an understanding about various types of houses, materials used to build them and helped to enhance their communication and presentation skills.


















BANANA LEAF ACTIVITY

The students perfected the task of spotting the differences between Singular and Plural Nouns and performed the activity marvellously.






This activity was intended to help the students of grade 2 understand the differences between young people and people of older generations and to sensitise them towards the problems of old age.


The children were asked to write a short paragraph of about 3 to 4 lines, listing their views on how young people are different from older ones.

A POSTCARD TO A FRIEND




INVENT A QUIZ


TELUGU ACTIVITY


GRADE-III VIVIDHA SPECIAL ASSEMBLY

POETRY IS AN ART




TELUGU - TOY MAKING




VARIATIONS


Though the objects used were simple the results were extraordinarily satisfactory. The students could understand the concepts or reflections, variation in the size of shadows w.r.t to the distance of the light source.

Being a hands-on experience activity, this task allowed the students to experiment with trial and error, learn from their mistakes, and understand the potential gaps between theory and practice.

The activities performed by the students in this lesson were the ones seen and experienced in real life, hence this topic was a bit closer to real life. Students studied the reason behind the formation of eclipses and the differences in the size of the sun and moon during the eclipse. Causes of reflection, its types, and its use in real-life were well explained by them in these activities.

At the end of the lesson, a SEA activity was conducted that was used as a reflection of all the topics they studied in the lesson.





GRADE-VII SKIT ACTIVITY

The students of Grade 7 were asked to present their hindi lesson 'Vano ka mahatva' in the form of a skit for their SEA. They were divided into groups and asked to write a story keeping the theme of the lesson in mind and present their stories in the form of skits.


PACKING






PROBABILITY ACTIVITY

The students of grade 9 were asked to present the relation between theoretical probability and experimental probability through a Powerpoint presentation.






STORY WRITING ON NAZISM

HINDI SPEAKING ACTIVITY ON DHARM KI AADH




The students of Grade 9 were taught a lesson in Hindi wherein the relationship between society and religion was explained.

They were assigned the job of giving a speech on topics related to religion. The topics were:


- 1. Dharm ka arth

BREAKFAST WITH BUDDIES


