

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Aloha 2021 ...till we meet again



Children were to pretend that they were in a crowded room and he/she had to convey a message-






GRADE - VI

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Workshop for Teachers







It provides an opportunity for children to exercise scientific thinking: make predictions, observations, comparison, reasoning, experimentation and evaluation.










The key to effective communication is good grammar. To strengthen the students' grammar an activity was conducted in the virtual class in which the teachers showcased a few words on flashcards and encouraged the students to read the words aloud and identify 'guninthapugurtulu.' In order to teach even and odd numbers, the students of grade 2 were asked to bring a few objects like pencils, spoons, and forks etc. which are available at home. Then, the teacher asked them to count the number of objects and pair them. An activity was conducted to explain the concept of punctuations. The students were equipped with flash cards of a few punctuation marks. Teacher showed different sentences without punctuation marks and the children had to guess the correct one according to the given sentence and show the relevant flash card.



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

This quote is apt for today's society. Before the corona time, people turned blind eyes to their diet,



Our First Day OF Grade 4 & this is what we felt...




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Children's drawings are used to access their views and experiences and ways to learn important creative skills. Art is one that seems useful and comfortable in expressing their feelings and ideas.
