Inter School Competition

MUN

The students from grades 7 to 10 participated in the Inter School Competition organized by Gokaraju Rangaraju Institute of Engineering and Technology (GRIET). Model United Nations (MUN) is an imitation of the United Nations where students from different schools come together to participate in debates, discussions, and negotiations on current international issues. It is an excellent platform for students to develop leadership, critical thinking, and public speaking skills. This year, MUN was held on the 5th and 6th of April, organized by Gokaraju Rangaraju Institute of Engineering and Technology (GRIET).

The event had four committees: G20 for discussion on the importance of Climate financing in achieving SDG 13. DISEC focussed on addressing the Proliferation of Small Arms and Light Weapons (SALW) with special emphasis on non-State-armed groups in conflicted areas. UNHRC held a discussion on Human Rights Violations in Conflict zones with special emphasis on Eastern Europe whereas UNODC discussed measures to control Drug trafficking with special emphasis on Fraudulent Medicines.

A total of 66 students from Grades 7 to 10 participated in the event, representing different countries. They conducted thorough research on their assigned countries and their policies and also worked on drafting resolutions and negotiating with other countries to reach a consensus. The students showcased their skills in public speaking, diplomacy, and critical thinking, while also learning about the current global issues and the UN's role in addressing them.

Overall, the MUN event was a great success. It provided an opportunity for the students to enhance their knowledge and skills in various aspects. It also helped them to develop an understanding of different cultures, perspectives, and global issues. The event was well-organized and conducted, and the participants enjoyed the experience thoroughly.

We appreciate the efforts of GRIET in organizing the event and look forward to participating in similar events in the future.



EARTH DAY CELEBRATION 2023

The mission of observing Earth Day every year is to "diversify, educate and activate the environmental movement worldwide". The theme for Earth Day 2023 is "Invest In Our Planet" and Delhi Public School, Miyapur played its part in the event's celebrations on the 20th of April with the apt theme "Environment and Sustainability" which was put up by the students of class 7.

The program was initiated with a brief history of how the Earth Day celebrations started, followed by a prayer and lighting of the lamp. The entire programme was a narrative through the eyes of a seed. The presentation portrayed how the lifestyle of mankind has changed, how we've started to care more about convenience than quality and how that is disruptive to our environment. There was a dazzling dance performance as well.

The seed witnessed a Model United Nations, in which the United States, India, Canada and Germany participated. The Paris Agreement was discussed which was made to help delay or avoid some of the worst consequences of climate change. It is meant to open up the floodgates for businesses, and scientists, and engineers to unleash high-tech, low-carbon investment and innovation at a scale that has never been seen before, giving us the best possible shot to save our one and only planet. This presentation was incredibly insightful, showing the students how real change is created on a global scale.

A skit in Hindi illustrated a girl who was passionate about the environment, relentlessly fighting for it, turning the hearts of careless polluters into vehement environmental activists. A dance performance represented environmentalists and industrialists in a tussle in which the good overpowered the evil eventually.

The seed also witnessed an experience shared by a student who went to IIT to study engineering and when he returned to his village, Parra in Goa, the deteriorated ways of the new generation of watermelon sellers caused Parra's best watermelons to go extinct. This experience implied the importance of employing the best to train the next generation so that we don't lose our roots, especially in a way that would be environmentally destructive.

This experience transitioned into the performance of the "Earth Day Song" written by Parveen Mehta. Some ways in which we can do our part in saving the environment were also shared, including ways to conserve fuel, electricity, being cautious about the materials we use every day, etc.

The audience was then addressed by Principal, Mrs. Gowri, who instilled in all the students a sense of belief in each one of them that they can be 'the revolutionaries' in their own ways and protect the beautiful earth. It was followed by a Vote of Thanks and the National Anthem.



Objective - To make them understand how to pronounce the long and short notes of each letter and the words associated with them


Outcome- Students enjoyed learning with their peers and were energetic throughout the session. They learnt the articulation of each letter and word with ease during the game.

Students excitedly made a note of their observations each single day.






Environmental Science Activity - My Healthy Plate

Students arranged the data in a tabular form. They have presented the details of every meal like breakfast, lunch, snacks and dinner. They have also mentioned the intake of water and roughage.


At the end of the activity the students compared the balanced diets and gave a comparative analysis report on the different components of food that were included in each case and they justified the analysis with appropriate reasons.




