COLOR week

Celebrations

(UKG on 25th March to 1st April, 2019)

Our world is filled with colours. A very important part of learning during kindergarten years is identification and recognition of colours. Colour week was celebrated from 25-3-19 to 1-4-19 starting with primary colours and followed by secondary colours. All the children from UKG and their teachers were dressed colourfully to celebrate this colour week. Children were excited to participate in various activities. Classrooms were decorated based on the concept of colour week with attractive pictures and benefits of the particular colour fruit. Teachers and students spoke about colours during circle time and sang rhymes on colours. Students showed their enthusiasm to mix paints to get secondary colours. They have done one layer of palm print each day on peacock based on the colour day. They made takeaways based on colours. Students drew and coloured the objects based on colour day. Each and every day they were involved in many activities like washing clothes, dance, rhymes, colour identification games, wearing shoes and socks, nature walk etc. they learnt the traffic rules on red colour day. They brought different food items based on the colour day celebration like sandwich, lemonade, orange, grapes apple etc. It was an excellent learning experience for children which will enhance their visual discrimination.

Day wise activities:

Blue colour day

On 25th blue colour day was celebrated. Students were taken for an outdoor activity where they learnt how to wash clothes. Later they were involved in many activities like palm print on peacock, colouring of peacock, draw and colour objects which are blue in colour. Teacher spoke about the benefits of berries by showing the chart. By using all-purpose flour, food colour, oil, salt, water and cloves they learnt to make a fish as the takeaway. Children showed great joy while indulging in all activities.



Red colour day



On 26th red colour day was celebrated. Students were taken for an outdoor activities where they had a practical examples of traffic signals. Later they have done palm print activity, cotton bud dabbing on picture of tomato, draw and colour red colour objects. Take away was given as a butterfly where they did their palm print.



Yellow colour day



On 27th yellow colour day was celebrated. Students had a practical experience how to wear shoes and socks. They had group activity of palm print on peacock, colouring on the picture of sun, draw and colour yellow colour objects. Teacher spoke about the benefits of lemon. Take away was given chick/pineapple with the palm print.



Orange colour day



On 28th orange colour day was celebrated. Students were involved in dance and song. They had a group activity of palm printing on peacock, colouring on the star fish, draw and colour orange colour objects. Teacher spoke about the benefits of orange. Take away was given a lion mask where children painted paper plate using sponge and fingers.



Green colour day

On 29th green colour day was celebrated. Students were taken for a nature walk where they explored different parts of plants. They collected the fallen leaves and came to class they made a tiara with newspaper, they put thumb impression and paste the leaves they collected. They involved in group activity of palm print, cut and paste green coloured paper on given tree out line picture, draw and colour green colour objects. Teacher spoke about the benefits of guava.



Purple colour day



On 1st April purple day was celebrated. Students learnt the rhymes on colours in circle time. They were involved in group activity, wool dabbing and colouring brinjal, draw and colour purple colour objects. Teacher spoke about on the benefits of jamun. Takeaway was given where students made bottle cap printing on paper napkin.
