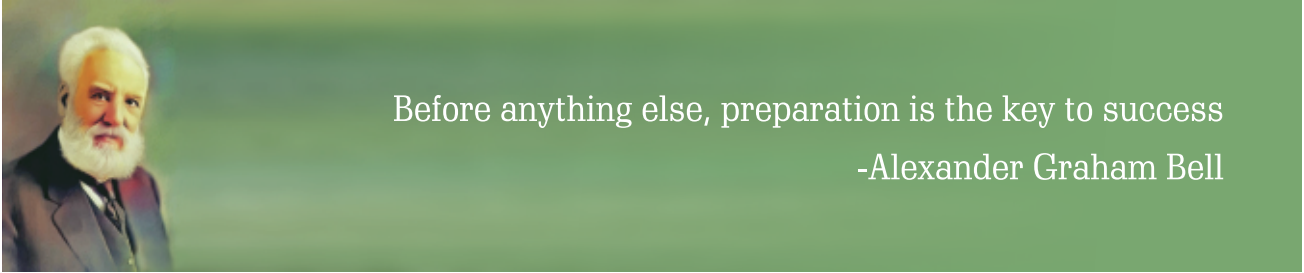

The competition which was conducted on Sep 25th, 2019 started at 8:30AM and ended by around 9:45AM. The students were divided into eight groups with four students in each group. All the eight groups were named based on the famous dynasties of the past like the Pallavas, Pandyas, Chalukyas, Satavahanas, Cholas, Kakatiyas, Mauryas and the Yadavas.

This quiz competition was conducted by Jal house. The rules and regulations of the quiz were explained at the start of the competition. It was a four round competition which included an unscramble the words round (paper and pencil), an audio round, match the states with their capitals round (paper and pencil) and a visual round. These kept the students engaged for almost an hour and half. The students showed their brilliance by rapidly answering the questions. Though a few questions were tricky, the students tried to answer them with confidence. The audience also got a chance to participate every time the teams answered incorrectly. The audience was very lively and they enjoyed cheering the participants. The participants and the audience especially enjoyed the audio round. After the end of the four rounds there was a special audience round where the audience were given a chance to participate in the quiz competition. Appreciation certificates were given to the students who answered the questions correctly.

Though all the teams participated actively, the group that won the first place were the Chalukyas from Prithvi house. The second place winners were the Kakatiyas from Jal house and the third place winners were the Mauryas again from the Jal house. The list of winners was announced by Ms.Raina Bhatt, the Head Mistress of the Junior Wing of DPS Miyapur. Everyone clapped and cheered for the ecstatic winning teams. She congratulated the winning teams and encouraged the students to be updated by reading the newspaper regularly improve it also their general knowledge.

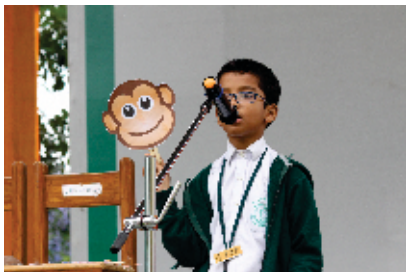
The final round was conducted by Ms Divya and Ms Sangeeta. Ms Koel and Ms Preeti were the judges.
