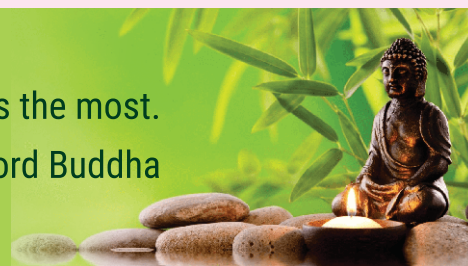

A special assembly was held at Delhi Public School, Miyapur on the occasion of 5th Telangana Formation Day on 15th June, 2019 by the students of DPS-Miyapur. They put up an impeccable show where they showcased the multifarious culture, rich traditions, fascinating history, and the inimitable spirit of Telangana. The assembly began with the soulful school prayer followed by the flag hoisting by our respected Head Ms. Gowri Sarkar and Head mistress Ms. Raina Bhatt.

The students spoke about the state's struggle, which dated back from 1948 until 2014. They presented a soulful patriotic song on Telangana "Jay Jay Telangana". The song was a piece of art in itself. It speaks of the pride of the people of Telangana as well as their sacrifices. After the melodious song, was a brilliant mime show that showcased the struggles that the people of Telangana faced under the Nizam's dictatorship. The act was divided into three phases. The third phase of the mime represented the "All People's Strike" after which finally Telangana became an independent and the 29th state on 2nd June, 2014. It was truly a visual delight to watch them perform.

RAMZAN Special Assembly

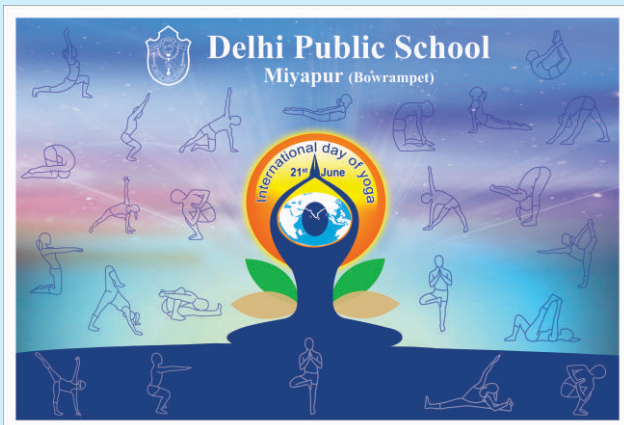
(Grade III on 20th June, 2019)
