They boarded the buses after prayer time so that they could get ample time to see the fort. The Fort is opened for the public at 9am. They reached there at 9:20am. The teachers hired a guide to show Them around the fort, the majestic palace rooms, corridors and garden.

The first sight that greeted them was the number of visitors clapping underneath the dome, trying to emulate the improvised warning system that the fort used. The guide explained that the warning clap under the dome could alert the troops garrisoned in the fortress. Moving on, they climb up the stairs as Golconda unraveled history part by part. They were shown the granary, Ibrahim Mosque, Mahakali temple, Baradari. The baradari is the highest point of view in the fort, and as expected a panoramic view of the city was a visual treat.

The guide informed that it is believed to have a secret underground passage that connects the durbar halls, which is situated at the top, to one of the palaces situated at the bottom of the hill.
