- Countries are more connected nowadays with which we can have more knowledge










THE PALACE OF ILLUSIONS

Book Review on 'The Palace of Illusions' by Chitra Banerjee Divakaruni



Our Indian culture is famous for its Mythology and Literary Works such as the Ramayana, the Mahabharata, and The Gita. Owing to their threshold of values, flamboyant stories, and applicable life lessons, these chronicles have been translated into many different languages like the Razmnamah — a translation of the Mahabharat in Persian and have gained critical acclaim across the globe.

It's worthy to note that out of all these religious works, the Mahabharata is the most 'human story' we can find. Based on contraries as diverse as possible, like morals and deceits, love and hatred, vengeance, and forgiveness, it covers all the situations we imperfect mortals can come across. But when we cross the bridge of morals present in the Mahabharata, one can't help but notice that most of these ideologies have been presented by the male characters in the story.

'The Palace of Illusions' is a marvelous novel, a contemporary Mahabharata. Penned by the magical hand of Dr. Chitra Divakaruni, it opens a new door, a novel perspective on the ageold saga. Here, the narrating voice has been shifted to Panchaali, daughter of King Drupad, sister of Dhrishtadhyumna, the *Sakhi* of Krishna, and the wife of the Pandavas. Born from fire, with a fierce character, she tells her own story - neglected, rare, and just as precious. She fills in the gaps of the epic with her feelings and views that aren'tconsidered. From her secluded childhood, where her brother and Krishna were the only beacons of light, to her marriage with five of the greatest warriors of her time, to the devasting war - the result she had to reap of her actions, and at last, to the ultimate end she faced, this story covers all that she has been through. Hence, by giving primacy to her feelings, it's proved that women have their morals, their hatred, and yes, their vengeance too...

This is a must-read novel for the years 13 and above, a woman's take on a domain dominated by men and gods. An event that took place when the world was shifting into the grip of the Kali-Yuga.
















THE HUGE DIVINE WORLD


The world is divine



I will just give you a brief info about Pokémon if you don't know about it -





THE RISE AND FALL OF THE BERLIN WALL

The Berlin wall was a large wall that was built in Berlin has started construction on August 13th, 1961, and continued for the next decade. To understand it further we must go back to the 2nd world war when the allies were trying to defeat the axis powers. Once they had defeated Nazi Germany each of the victorious nations had occupied a part of the nation. This division was meant to be temporary but the former allies had found themselves at odds for their vision of post-war Germany. The western powers like America, France, and Britain wanted to promote liberal market economies while The Soviet Union sought to surround itself with obedient communist countries including a weakened Germany. As their relations deteriorated 2 new nations were formed were a federal republic of Germany (FROG) and The German democratic republic (GDR) which were located in the west and the east in that order. The soviet countries didn't want any resources from western Germany so a virtually impassable border known as "The Iron Curtain" was formedthat separated the 2 nations. Things were even more complicated in the former capital of Germany Berlin which was entirely in the GDR as per the agreement FROG also had a bit of Berlin's territory and would take the western part of Germany. Eastern Germans were also banned from leaving the country they could just go over to West Berlin by foot, bus or any other means of transport and travel to The territory of FROG or leave Germany though for this posed a problem for soviet leaders as millions were leaving their half so they had decided to construct the Berlin wall which extended for 43 kilometres and further 112 kilometres through east Germany the initial wall comprised of barbed wire and mesh fencing though many Berliners jumped over the wall or jumped from a window into West Germany but as the wall expanded this became more difficult by 1965 106 Km of 3.6 metre tall concrete walls had been constructed topped with a smooth pipe to prevent people from climbing over the wall over many years the protection was strengthened with guard dogs, land mines and spike strips along with 302 watchtowers and 20 bunkers a parallel fence in the rear set off a 100 meter area called the death strip there all buildings were demolished and covered with sand so that the guards could see people trying to escape and shoot them. About 100 people made it to West Berlin but many more were killed trying to cross. Eventually, families could meet each other through the Berlin wall but it cost high fees and it was a very tedious process. In the year 1980, the process was made less tedious after the announcement hundreds of Berliners protested and surprised the guards. The guards tried to stop them but they just couldn't and they tore down the Berlin wall leaving some parts as a sign that division is not permanent after this loss The Soviet Union fell for good.
